### HTSA is Born

The past few weeks has seen ALL Supporters Groups working hard behind the scenes to represent all fans, to communicate with the Club, and to formulate the idea of a Single Supporters Group which is ALL inclusive.

June also saw a poll on DATM which resulted in the one supporters group being named.

**HTSA** was chosen by over 65% of voters and Huddersfield Town Supporters Association was born.

### New Website Launched

The Steering Group have produced both an information flyer and a membership form and hundreds of them were distributed at the recent away kit launch.

In the near future they will be distributed at the Sheffield United and Arsenal games, as well as at the club's Open Day which will be held on Friday 11th July.

### Match Day Information

At every home match day throughout the season the HTSA portacabin (formerly the Supporters Club portacabin) at the top of the hill by the St Andrews Rd car park will be open for people to become members, or sign up for coach travel to any of the club's away games, for which HTSA members will pay a

reduced amount.

### Meetings with the Club

In June a representative of the group, Marcus Middleton has met on several occasions with Sean Jarvis to help carve out several initiatives and take supporters concerns to the club as the relationship between supporters and club continues to flourish.

### Further Information

HTSA is the only unified supporters group. The group consists mainly of people who were previously part of The Supporters Trust or Supporters Club or FFA (or a mixture of the groups).

HTSA is in place and is evolving itself with input from all parties, and in September when there has been a concerted membership drive there will be the opportunity

Under-13s - 1,574 (10%)

been balanced in the  
near future.

**CATERING Update**

The Club and Catering  
Company (EMC) have  
listened to supporters  
concerns regarding  
catering in a series of  
meetings, and all parties  
have gained some  
positives from them.

EMC are aware of  
problems incurred in the  
past but during a season  
it is hard to implement  
change. However, they  
are committed to getting  
things right for next  
season. They have now  
recruited 30 new staff,  
with up to another 50  
expected to be hired  
before the start of the  
2008/09 campaign

There will be a wider  
variety of food and  
confectionary in the  
coming season.

There will also be two  
mobile units which will  
be situated on the  
perimeter of the pitch  
before the match and at  
half-time. Drinks will be  
pre-poured prior to half-

time to accommodate  
the initial surge and,  
sometime early on in the  
season, lager will be sold  
in plastic bottles.

The hope is that such  
changes will alleviate the  
size of queues and free  
up staff to provide a  
more efficient service.

Town are giving away **FREE** window stickers to ALL supporters!

The Club is urging supporters to get involved with their "All Together Now" campaign for the Centenary season.

Town are making **30,000** stickers available to supporters, their families and their friends to help spread the word. As Sean Jarvis explains: "The "All Together Now" theme was chosen to celebrate the Club breaking their season ticket record and that the Club and it's 16,000 plus supporters want to bring glory back to Huddersfield Town and that we're in it together"

The stickers can be collected from either the shop in town on Cloth Hall Street or from the stadium superstore at the Galpharm and are absolutely **FREE**.

The Club will be running competitions relating to stickers displayed in car windows in the not too distant future and are urging as many supporters as possible to get behind this campaign.

There is no purchase necessary and they are **FREE** but limited to 3 per person, so why not take one for someone else and help us spread the word that we are "All Together"

Town fans will be able to catch any First Bus within the area to Huddersfield town centre, and then catch one of the new shuttle buses running directly to the stadium at 15 minute intervals. The return trips will also be included in the price. It is hoped that this could help to alleviate potential parking problems with the forthcoming season's increased crowds flocking to the stadium. Further details, and prices, will be announced shortly.
